Working with Families

Some Basic Guidelines:

ACCEPT: Accept each family as people of worth with unique strengths, feelings and ways of reacting to life. This means being nonjudgmental and communicating honestly.

RESPECT: Respect each family for the job that they do. Respect the deep feelings involved in the family dynamics and relationships.

SUPPORT: Parents and families need friendly support and sympathetic understanding. Comfort often comes from airing problems to an understanding ear. Reassurance builds confidence.

LISTEN: Listening can be active, dynamic and vital. It can reflect each of the above; acceptance, respect and support. The very willingness to listen denotes an appreciation of what families have to share. It confirms a basic respect for the individuals and an interest in what they are saying.

BE: Availability promotes good communication. Explanation and **AVAILABLE** discussion can eliminate misunderstandings. Attempt to develop a feeling of common concern, shared by catechist, volunteer, leaders and parents, for each other's growth.

LEARN: Parents and children can and will share many things that help catechists and leaders know and understand the family. Be genuinely receptive. Catechists and leaders too, can grow and change.

INVOLVE: Families can learn by participating and being involved in activities and programs. Be creative in developing ways to involve families. Discover and use their individual talents.
